

1.0 ATTIRE.

Proper attire contributes to the decorum and atmosphere of the Club and is required at all times in the public areas of the Club Facilities. It is the responsibility of each Member to follow these guidelines and to advise their families and guests of the appropriate attire for any event. Members, their families, and guests not in compliance with the dress code can be denied use of Club Facilities.

Appropriate attire is required to be worn by all members and guests while using club facilities and may be specific based on the time of day. Listed below are the requirements for members and guests in the Clubhouse. Similar requirements for other Club facilities such as Golf, Tennis, Croquet, swimming, etc. may be noted elsewhere in the rules for each specific area.

Club Management and staff have been directed to enforce these rules and may report violators of the Dress Code Policy to the appropriate Committee for review if corrections to attire are not made in a timely manner. We appreciate your understanding of this matter.

Special Events: From time to time the Club may host special theme parties or events. Specific Dress Code standards shall be noted in the notice or invitation for each event that may supersede the dress code requirements listed below. Management shall, at its discretion, determine the suitability of specific event dress code.

Appropriate Daytime Attire in the Dining Rooms, Dunes Tavern and Creek Clubhouse:

Gentlemen and boys may wear slacks, Bermuda-length shorts, collared sport shirts, mock turtlenecks, and golf shirts. Headwear for Gentlemen is not permitted at any time inside of either clubhouse. Gentlemen may wear caps/hats while on the Dunes Terrace and the Creek Patio before 4:00 p.m. each day. Headwear for Gentlemen after 4:00 p.m. is not permitted.

Ladies and girls may wear Bermuda-length shorts, capris, dresses, blouses, shirts, tops (except halter tops), dress skirts, dress pants, dress suits or golf shirts.

Children, with the exception of toddlers (under age 5) and infants must comply with all other standards of the dress code as described above.

Appropriate Evening (post 5:30 p.m.) Attire in the Dining Rooms, Dunes Tavern and Creek Clubhouse:

Gentlemen and boys may wear slacks, collared shirts, mock turtlenecks, or golf shirts; jackets optional. Bermuda shorts may only be worn in the Dunes Tavern or on the Creek Patio for dinner service.

Ladies and girls may wear capris, dresses, blouses, shirts, tops (except halter tops), dress skirts, dress pants, dress suits or golf shirts in any of the dining facilities after 5:30 p.m. year-round. Appropriate (not 5-pocket with rivets) colored denim (not blue) may be worn in the dining rooms. Bermuda shorts may only be worn in the Dunes Tavern or on the Creek Patio for dinner service.

Children, with the exception of toddlers (under age 5) and infants must comply with all other standards of the dress code as described above.

Dress Code Specifics:

- Dress jeans are permitted in all areas of the Links Clubhouse and the Creek Clubhouse at all times with the exception of the Seaside Dining Room and Oceanview Ballroom, where jeans are not permitted. Jeans/denim is not appropriate on the golf courses/practice facilities, tennis and croquet courts. Appropriate denim/dress jeans are not faded or low rise and are free of holes, frayed edges and visible rips or tears. This includes children.
- Collarless shirts, sweat pants, and exercise attire may only be worn in the locker rooms or sport and fitness areas or when dining on the Dunes Tavern Terrace (daytime only).
- Shirttails must be tucked in everywhere, unless the shirt is specifically manufactured to be worn un-tucked.
- Swimming attire is restricted to the pool area.
- Tennis attire is appropriate in the Dunes Tavern with proper cover ups.
- Dress code for the Bocce Ocean Courts: Before 4 p.m., appropriate casual attire, including proper swim coverups. After 4 p.m., the Tavern dress code is in effect (Bermuda shorts and collared shirts for the gentlemen and corresponding attire for the ladies).
- In any area of confusion regarding what constitutes appropriate attire the GM/COO, or his/her designee, shall make the final determination.

Golf Attire:

To maximize the playing conditions of our golf course and practice areas, all players must wear non-penetrating, spikeless shoes when playing the golf course, or using the practice range, practice putting and chipping greens. Non-penetrating, spike-less shoes include: all makes and models of “soft” spikes, golf shoes with flat plastic or rubber “nubbies”.

Types of shoes not permitted include: retractable metal spikes, golf shoes with any length metal or ceramic spikes. Juniors may wear sneakers and tennis shoes. Due to the changing nature of the product and market, the Board of Governors reserves the right to determine which new products are appropriate.

Players assume the risk of injury associated with utilizing spikeless shoes under all conditions. To minimize the risk of slipping or falling, caution is urged when walking in wet conditions or on hills or steep slopes, dead grass, wooden course features, e.g., on bridges, platforms, steps and bricks, or on hard smooth surfaces, or in golf cars.

All men using the golf course or practice areas must wear shirts with collars and sleeves (mock turtlenecks are acceptable). Men’s shirttails must be tucked in.

Ladies must wear collared shirts, non-collared shirts with sleeves, or tailored sleeveless shirts with collars. No sleeveless, collarless shirts are permitted.

For both men and women, shorts are to be of conservative tailoring. Acceptable length is at least 17 inches from the waist to the bottom of the shorts or skirt. Women may wear slacks at any time.

Acceptable pants and shorts are those that have flat side pockets and are trim cut. Unacceptable pants are baggy cut with oversized pockets. All hats, at all times, must be worn with the bill of the cap facing forward.

The following is unacceptable golf apparel: running shorts, basketball shorts, jams, cutoffs, shorts without pockets, blue jeans or denims of any type, dungarees, tennis or swim wear, T-shirts, collarless shirts (except as noted above), tank tops, football jerseys, or any type of shirt with printed phrases or slogans.

While the dress code for children under 5 is relaxed, they are expected to be neatly attired.

Members are responsible for the attire of their guests. The Director of Golf or other golf staff may deny course and practice privileges to any individual whose attire does not conform to the dress code.

Appropriate attire is available in the Golf Shop. Members are encouraged to make purchases there.
