

MGA News...

Golf Etiquette and Pace of Play Submitted by Ed McDonald, Secretary of the HDMGA

The MGA wanted to share this with ALL MGA and LGA members, as we think all can benefit from it. Please accept this advice in the spirit it is intended.

We need to pick up our pace of play. There is no excuse for not completing 18 holes of golf, with carts, in four hours or less. Because we are playing in a group setting, slow play affects everyone, whether it is the group(s) directly behind us or the group(s) waiting in the clubhouse.

Don't be a spectator - Get out of your cart and go to your ball or take the cart to your ball, while your cart partner is playing his/her shot. While there are times when this is not possible, due to the line of play, the majority of time this will be possible.

Move out of the way - After you hit a shot or are leaving a green, get in the cart **with** the clubs you just used. Put them back in the bag the next time the cart stops.

Scorekeepers - Record scores from the just completed hole at the next tee.

When on the green - Line up your putt while others are preparing to putt. Be ready to immediately stroke your putt when it's your turn.

Play ready golf - If you are ready to play, and by doing so you are not going to interfere with another player - then **GO**!



On mornings when starting times are delayed due to frost, the following policy will be implemented:

In the event of a delay all tee times will be moved back an amount of time equal to the duration of the delay. Play will commence when it is determined by the maintenance staff that the course is prepared for play after a frost delay. It is imperative that rescheduled groups be at the tee and ready to play when called.

HDLGA News... 18 Holers



The focus of this month's column is the HDLGA 2022 Survey results. But, first, I want to call your attention to a very important MGA article in this issue about pace of play. Please read it and keep the key points in mind while playing our beautiful courses. Slow play can take the fun out of golf.

Survey Results

Thanks to the 112 LGA members who completed the LGA recent satisfaction survey. Here's a brief summary of key takeaways from the responses.

• The majority of LGA members are satisfied or very satisfied with the LGA. It's hard to please everyone, but we are encouraged by this and will aim for 100% satisfaction.



- Only half of our members regularly play in LGA tournaments. Primary reasons for not playing: start times are too early and many don't like to play competitively. Those who like and those who don't like scrambles were equally divided.
- Ladies' Days have not been particularly popular, so we asked what would make you more likely to play--most common responses: later start time, more players at my skill level, more ABCD format events, flighted play.
- As for recommended improvements for the LGA, the responses ran the gamut... no scrambles; more scrambles; engage 9-holers; vary formats; have more play "just for fun" days.

The survey provided valuable info for the LGA Board, and we are working to address concerns that came to light. Not all our members have the same needs, so offering variety is one way to address those differences.

Remember: The main function of the LGA is to provide the best golf experience for its 220 members, but we can't do it without you. If you don't usually play in tournaments, give one a try. Tournaments are flighted, so all levels can compete. Participate in Ladies' Days—even just one/month; they're a great way to make new friends and golf buddies.







Audubon Corner...

Feeding birds is great when their food supply is scarce. Late fall, winter and early spring are times that they may need help. When nature gives them all that they need, food should not be given as it affects them in a negative way, especially the young as their native food is not yet available.



The knowledge of the species that live in your area and type of food to feed is important. Some need help and other do not. For example, Gray Jays as opposed to Owls. Three questions must be applied to any bird feeding:

- 1. Is the species at risk? It is now illegal to feed some, such as Florida Scrub Jays unless you have a permit.
- 2. Is the appropriate food being provided? Berry plant species native to each part of the country can be looked up in Audubon's native plant database. Cabbage Palm Berries are abundant in the Hammock. One of the least healthy foods is bread, as it has little nutritional value. It may cause a condition called "Angle Wing." Opt instead for cracked corn or oats. Keep your feeder clean.



3. Is feeding this bird likely to change its behavior in harmful ways? Collisions with vehicles are a leading cause of death for owls. The simple rule is, don't feed close to roadways.
