Lightning Detection Policy / Procedure

Members are expected to exercise reasonable prudence and common sense when severe weather, e.g., thunder or lightning, is reported or observed in the area.

Both golf courses have sirens that will sound to notify all members on the golf courses, practice facilities, croquet lawns, pool and tennis facilities that dangerous weather is in the area. Immediately upon hearing the siren sound (one long blast), all members must leave their outdoor activities and seek appropriate shelter.

The siren will sound again (three short blasts) when it is safe to resume to outdoor activities. Members who fail to exercise prudence and common sense by evacuating the golf course when lightning is observed or reported, may be subject to Board discipline.

The golf course weather feature on the Club App is available to all members and will indicate when it is safe to resume outdoor activities.

News from the Golf Shop..

Well as this article hits the press, we can say we are officially in the "dog days of summer"! July was a frustrating month for most of us, as the mid to late day thunderstorms and lightning delays seemed more than normal. As I keep hearing in my first summer in Florida, it is that time of the year.

While the heat can be unbearable at times, combine the heat with high humidity and as we saw numerous times in July, the result can be a heat index warning. Keep in mind that with all of the moisture in the air and in the ground, the morning time can be just as taxing on our bodies as 3 p.m. can be. Always remember to properly hydrate, use our cold towel stations on #6 and #15, and it is always a good idea to keep a Gatorade, candy bar, or some form of quick sugar in the golf bag or golf cart so that you can get to it quickly.

While it is hot out, if we are properly hydrated and feeling well, there should be no reason we all can't still work on our golf games. One tip I would pass along that should be used all of the time but especially in the summer heat is to take your time while you practice. Don't be that player that hits a shot, swipes another ball over, and hits again. "Rapid fire" practice in the summer heat is not conducive to keeping your cool. Instead, take your time, pull a ball over, go through your on-course pre-shot routine and then play the shot. After, take a moment, pull another ball over and begin the process again. This will allow you to practice more effectively as well as not wear yourself out and potentially overheat. Hope this tip helps you during the summer heat and as always: repair your ball marks, fix your divots and play well play fast, play poor play faster!!


