

From the Desk of Tim Timlin General Manager

Dear Members.

Hopefully as you are reading this edition of your March Dunescape you have already received your first invitation to participate in our Hammock Dunes survey. On the heels of receiving your invite I want to say Thank You to all of those who participated in the focus groups with Global Golf. The spirited discussion and open communication allowed GGA to produce a series of questions that are sure to address your concerns regarding the Club presently and more importantly our path to a prosperous future.

While there were many topics of discussion during the focus group sessions, one that was discussed in multiple groups was the adherence to Club policies and the state of general decorum around the campus. It is fair to say that these occurrences are still in the minority, but their frequency, scope and impact are definitely on the rise. The two most frequent infractions that are visible at the Club are dress code and animals, specifically dog walking. Appropriate attire in our venues, including dining rooms, is put in place to maintain the environment, atmosphere and level of expected decorum suitable for that location. These policies are also intended to maintain and assure the member of the experience intended. Each section of the Dress Code is approved by the Club Committee responsible for the area with oversight performed by Club Management. The second area is that of animals and as mentioned the majority surrounds dog walking on campus. Domesticated animals with the exception of certified service animals are not permitted on Club grounds nor in either clubhouse. The focus of these infractions has been occurring on the golf course and the areas encompassing racquet sports. Please know that our Dress Code is included in the General Club Rules found on the Club website, and our team will be applying all policies on a more consistent basis.

One of the fastest growing committees within our industry is the long-forgotten Grievance Committee. While this committee was a mainstay in years past, it has slipped into obscurity but has certainly returned with a vengeance. Grievances usually come about through the aforementioned policy infractions or decorum concerns. The Club has witnessed increased instances of animated discussion between individuals as well as disrespectful actions that may not be commonly accepted. Protecting our culture and community remains at the top of our priority list.

HDLGA News... 18 Holers

In March, we can anticipate the arrival of spring weather, along with the highly anticipated Mixed Club Championship, Men's Club Championship, and Ladies' Club Championship. If you have not yet registered, please take the time to do so.

On February 14, we successfully hosted our first-ever, "Sweetheart Open", at the Creek course. Thirty six couples participated in a two-person team golf competition. We would like to express our sincere gratitude to Sue Scott for her exceptional organization of this event. At the time of writing this article, the Masters Challenge is scheduled to take place on February 21. I will provide a detailed update on this event in the upcoming issue.

I would like to address the issue of pace of play. It continues to be a concern, especially with the increasing number of golfers and higher tournament attendance. Therefore, as a gentle reminder. Here are a few tips to bear in mind:

Plan your shot before you get to your ball - Once you are off the tee, think ahead. Determine your yardage and make your club selection before it is your turn to play.

Develop an eye for distance - You don't have to step off yardage for every shot. If you need to determine precise distance, try to find a yardage marker before you reach your ball, then step off the yardage on the way to your ball. Or consider investing in an electronic rangefinder. If others you are playing with are not familiar with the course, the Rules permit players to exchange yardage information without penalty.

Keep up with the group in front of you - Your correct position on the course is immediately behind the group in front of you, not immediately in front of the group behind you. Arrive at your next shot just before the group in front leaves the area in front of you.

Be efficient on the putting green - Mark your ball and lift and clean it when you arrive at the putting green so you will be ready to replace it when it is your turn to play. You can usually line up your putt while others are putting, without disturbing them. Wait until the next tee to record your score.

Remember that picking up your ball is permitted by the USGA Handicap System - If not in an individual stroke play competition, it is generally OK to pick up your ball and move on to the next hole if you are "out" of a hole and want to maintain pace of play. This applies in match play and many forms of stroke play, including Stableford and best-ball play.





Creating your Cardiovascular Exercise Plan

The ultimate cardio plan is the one you design for yourself. Use the following variables to write down your weekly cardio plan and then put it into action:

- Frequency (how many days per week)
- Type of cardio (mix it up or stick with the same)
- Duration (how many minutes)
- Intensity level (RPE)
- Mode (resistance, speed or level)

*RPE is the Rate of Perceived Exertion and it is used to measure how hard your body works during physical activity. It runs from 0-10 and helps you rate mow much effort an activity takes. It can help you manage the intensity level and improve your cardio training.

Creating a plan for maintenance, health and fitness:

Frequency should be: 3-4 days per week 20-30 minutes per session (RPE* moderate to intense)

Creating a plan for maximum fat loss:

5-7 days per week 30-60 minutes per session (RPE moderate) 20-30 minutes per session (RPE intense)

Examples of moderate cardio exercises:

• Treadmill Walking:
Duration - 30 minutes
RPE 5
Steady State - hold pace and incline
5% incline

• Elliptical Machine: Duration - 30 minutes RPE - 5 Steady State Level 5

Examples of intense cardio exercises:

• Stationary Cycle:
Duration - 24 minutes
RPE 4-9
10 intervals (RRE 9 for 1 minute, RRE 4 for 1 minute, Alternate)
1 min/1min

• Stair climber:

Duration - 30 minutes RPE - 8

Steady State

Level - the level that takes your RPE to an 8 out of 10




